The main aim for the Targeted Intervention Programme is to offer an alternative, short term intervention to support their learning for a short amount of time. The programme enhances the educational experience for pupils by giving them the opportunity to learn in ways that would be unavailable without the programme.

Our programme provides pupils with the opportunity to:

- Improve progress
- Promote school engagement
- Influence positive behaviour change
- Improve and promote positive social skills

Improve pupil progress

People learn in different ways. The Targeted Intervention Programme gives a pupil the unique individualised support they need in order for them to improve their pupil outcomes. By working on a 1:1 basis or in focus groups, the pupils get tailored support and guidance in helping make progress in our school curriculum as well as with emotional and mental health.

Promote school engagement

The Targeted Intervention Programme allows for the misconceptions around PRUs to be addresses as well as promoting connections between pupil, school and parent/carers. The programme will offer strategies based on the managing and regulation of emotions as well as promoting the positive impact of being part of the whole school community. The programme can help promote/instil our school values and help inspire pupils who want to make a positive change in their outlook of school life.

Influence behaviour change

The Targeted Intervention Programme will focus on positive behaviours and social – norming to allow room for effective change of behaviour. The programme has the power to be tailored to a specific issue that needs resolving. This programme will allow pupils to learn valuable life skills through shared experiences, thereby giving pupils the skills to make a positive change for themselves, their families, school and the whole community.

Improve and promote positive social skills

The Targeted Intervention Programme will try to promote and improve pupils' social skills. Positive communication and action is essential in everyday life and by giving a wide range of tools to help promote this both the pupil and the wider community benefit.
