Strategy aims for disadvantaged pupils - academic achievement

Aim	Outcome
Pupils make at least expected progress in literacy with a high percentage making better than expected progress.	Closure in the progress of pupils compared with their peers in mainstream. A vast majority of pupil premium pupils will make better than expected progress thus closing the gaps between PP and non PP pupils. 97% expected, 89.33% accelerated progress
Improve reading performance of PP pupils	All PP pupils with good attendance make at least good progress in reading with no pupils making less than average. 100% made accelerated progress

Strategy aims for disadvantaged pupils – wider outcomes (e.g. independence)

Aim	Outcome
To improve attendance and behaviour of pupils allocated PP	<p>Fewer behaviour incidents recorded for these pupils Of those regularly attending at Broadwalk 73% made big improvements in their behaviour throughout the year.</p> <p>Robust and supportive behavioural intervention plans to be in place for these pupils. Harder to reach pupils placed on one to one made good progress when they came to the sessions. 60% saw an improvement in their behaviour when back in classes,</p> <p>Overall attendance for pupils eligible for PP to improve on their previous school's attendance with the ultimate aim to achieve 95% or above. 86% of PP pupils improved their attendance from mainstream.</p>
Aim for all PP pupils that live more than 3 miles away to be able to travel to school on school transport and home on public buses where appropriate.	Pupils with PP are able to travel independently on buses in preparation for a return to mainstream or specialist provision. All PP pupils were traveling home independently by the summer term with the exception of a small number that had family members collecting them. A small number of pupils (around 10% needed some taxi transport at some point during the school year.
Support for enhanced curriculum activities including BOLT and PE by engaging in the D of E programme, funded by the school, a	All pupils able to share their experiences and develop social skills that will stay with them for life On the whole good engagement with the
